**Laurel High School**

<p><b><u>Agriscience Power, Structural and Systems Technology</u></b></p> <p>Power, Structural, and Technical Systems is a three level pathway that includes the study of traditional areas in Agricultural Structures with today's current problem solving skills. The Power, Structural, and Technical Pathway will provide students with knowledge of construction and engineering career opportunities.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Agricultural Structural Systems I</li> <li>• Agricultural Structural Systems II</li> <li>• Agricultural Structural Systems III</li> </ul>	<p><b><u>Business/Marketing</u></b></p> <p>This pathway will prepare students for a career in marketing. Students will explore topics including, but not limited too, information management, planning, promotion, print advertising, product and service management, pricing, and selling. All students in the Business pathway are encouraged to participate in Business Professionals of America, BPA. <p><b><u>Plant &amp; Horticulture Sciences</u></b></p> <p>Plant &amp; Horticulture Sciences; this three level pathway includes the study of plant life cycles, classifications, functions, structures, reproduction, media, nutrients, as well as growth and cultural practices according to the State of Delaware Agriscience Education Standards. Courses of study include;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Intro to Horticulture</li> <li>• Horticulture II</li> <li>• Horticulture III</li> </ul>	<p><b><u>Family and Consumer Sciences</u></b></p> <p>Family and Consumer Sciences education focuses on the challenges of living and working in a diverse global society while strengthening the well-being of individuals and families across the lifespan. The focus of the program at Laurel High School is on Early Childhood Education.
